// Understanding Place-Based Learning

Defining Principles of PBL

- Embeds learning and views the community as a classroom
- Centered on individual learners
- Inquiry based to help students develop an understanding of their place in the world
- Incorporates local and global thinking and investigations
- Requires design thinking to find solutions to authentic problems
- Interdisciplinary approach



At LEAF, our students will focus on strengthening a set of employability skills through each project. These include collaboration, growth mindset, oral communication, written communication, and more. We will address real world problems/challenges and receive additional support through a community outing or bringing in a community-based professional.
